Dear Friends, Colleagues, and Community,

As we reflect on the past year and the progress we've made in 2024, we are proud to celebrate the artists, educators, and community members who continue to make the Performance Garage a vital part of Philadelphia's vibrant dance scene. This year marks a significant milestone as we enter our twenty-fifth year of supporting the Philadelphia dance scene. We are grateful to have been part of the creative journeys of so many talented individuals.

In 2024, we had the privilege of supporting 118 companies and choreographers who used our space to create new work, present their premieres, and connect with our community. Our studios hosted countless classes, rehearsals, auditions, and video shoots, while our theater welcomed new productions that captivated audiences. In total, over 10,600 people came through our doors, making this year a reminder of the power of art and community.

Our signature programs, *DanceVisions, HubChats, DanceFilms*, and *DanceSpace*, flourished and provided invaluable opportunities for artists and audiences to engage with contemporary dance in dynamic and meaningful ways. We also continued our long tradition of supporting master teachers in Ballet, Contemporary Dance, Egyptian Dance, Martial Arts, and Yoga, enriching the artistic development of our students.

In addition, we are particularly proud of our *YouthMoves* program in partnership with the Franklin Learning Center high school as we provided weekly free dance classes to students. We also launched a two-week Summer Intensive that culminated in a stunning performance as part of our two-night Fall concert, showcasing the work of our *DanceVisions* resident artists—yaTande Whitney V. Hunter, Weiwei Ma, and Meredith Rainey.

We were also thrilled to present the world premiere of Meredith Rainey's *Building* in May as part of our 2023-2024 *DanceVisions* Residency. Supported by lead sponsor William Penn Foundation, the National Endowment for the Arts, the Dolfinger-McMahon Foundation, and generous individual donors, this performance marked a high point in our ongoing commitment to providing artists with the time, space, and resources they need to create new work. Looking ahead, we are excited to follow Megan Mazarick, our newest *DanceVisions* resident artist, as she develops her new work *Soapbox* throughout this year-long residency. The Performance Garage will produce her World Premiere in a three-night concert season planned for May 2025.

As we reflect on all we've accomplished in 2024, I am deeply grateful for the dedication of our staff, the support of our Board, and the continued interest of our donors and patrons. Every single one of you plays a vital role in keeping the Performance Garage alive and thriving.

Finally, I am thrilled to share a special announcement for 2024: we now own our building! Thanks to the incredible generosity of Victor Keen, our Co-Founder and Board President, who made the historic gift of the building's ownership to the Performance Garage 501(c)(3), we are now fully secure in our future and can continue serving our community for years to come.

We are excited to move into our 25th anniversary year with so much momentum, and we look forward to the many exciting moments still to come. Thank you for being a part of this incredible journey. With gratitude,

ABOUT PERFORMANCE GARAGE

Founded in 2000 by Jeanne Ruddy and Victor Keen, the Performance Garage is at the forefront of the dance community in Philadelphia. Started as a home for Jeanne Ruddy and Dancers, Inc., the Performance Garage is now a resource for emerging talents, a home for performers and teachers, and a thought-leader in the growing ecosystem of dance in the city. As a catalyst for creativity, the Performance Garage creates an environment that nurtures dance artists and facilitates the building of a broader audience for dance in Philadelphia.

The Performance Garage strives to be a nationally-recognized dance organization, creating a sustainable home for artistic excellence and providing diverse programming for Philadelphia audiences. The National Endowment for the Arts has supported our *DanceVisions* Artist Residency program with two prestigious Grants for Arts Projects, for yaTande Whitney V. Hunter and Jude Sandy (AKA Denizen Arts, 2021), and Meredith Rainey (2024). Though a wonderful endorsement of *DanceVisions*, these grants cover only a fraction of the total cost of running the program.

Throughout its history, the Performance Garage has demonstrated a commitment to equity and inclusion, providing space at significantly subsidized rental rates to allow diverse artists the opportunity to develop their practice —to host classes, rehearse, create new work, and showcase their choreography through performances—in an affordable and affirming space with access to technical and marketing professionals.

Housed in a converted 1865 horse stable, the Performance Garage draws between 10,000 to 15,000 people per year. As part of the greater North Broad Street redevelopment, the Performance Garage is the center of this increasingly significant cultural corridor and is the only entity of its kind in Philadelphia.






Total Engagement: 10,600
